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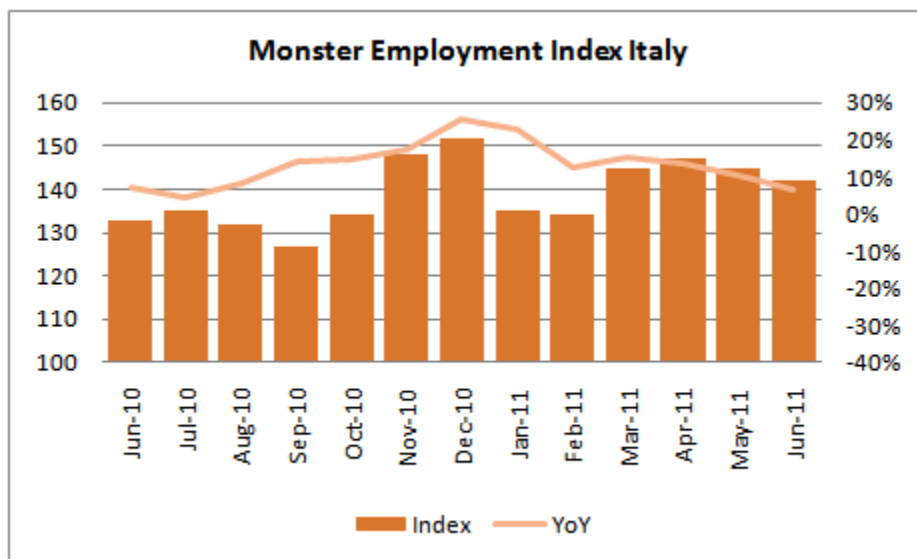
Monster Employment Index Italy Rises 7% in June

June 2011 Index Highlights:

- Italy maintains its positive growth trajectory with seven percent growth in June
- Production, manufacturing, maintenance continues to lead all sectors by measure of annual growth
- Healthcare, social work demonstrates an increased rate of annual decline in June, and is now the lowest performing industry in the Index
- Craft and related workers exhibits the fastest rate of annual growth of all occupational groups
- Sicilia leads all regions with significant annual gains in online recruitment

The Monster Employment Index Europe is a monthly gauge of online job demand based on a real-time review of millions of employer job opportunities culled from a large representative selection of career websites and online job listings across Europe. The Index does not reflect the trend of any one advertiser or source, but is an aggregate measure of the change in job listings across the industry.

“Index results show sectors such as manufacturing and transport continue to drive growth for Italy’s job market”, says Nicola Rossi, country manager, Monster Italy. “An encouraging sign is the positive 7 percent growth despite the notable declines in the healthcare and public sectors.”

Industry Year-over-year Trends: 10 of the 21 industry sectors monitored by the Index exhibited positive annual growth trends.

- **Production, manufacturing, maintenance, repair** (up 27 percent) continued to lead all sectors by measure of annual growth
- **Arts, entertainment, sports, leisure** (up 12 percent) showed a more positive trend, becoming one of the top five trending industries
- **Hospitality and tourism** (down 20 percent) registered an increased rate of decline year-over-year, despite this industry usually demonstrating growth at this time of year
- **Healthcare, social work** (down 33 percent) was the lowest growth industry in June

Occupation Year-over-year Trends: Annual online demand for workers rose in five of the nine occupational categories in June.

- **Craft and related workers** (up 32 percent) exhibited the fastest annual growth at a rate substantially higher than all other occupational groups
- **Plant and machine operators and assemblers** (up eight percent) continued to maintain a steady growth rate in June
- **Technicians and associate professionals** (down six percent) registered the largest annual decline among all occupations

Geographic Year-over-year Trends: 11 of the 20 regions monitored by the Index recorded positive growth trends in June.

- **Sicilia** (up 23 percent) led all regions with significant annual gains in online recruitment
- Among the larger regional markets, **Lazio** (up 16 percent) and **Veneto** (up 16 percent) demonstrated significant annual growth
- **Abruzzo** (down 12 percent) saw an increased rate of decline, placing it last in the Index

International Trends:

The Monster Employment Index Europe demonstrated 23 percent annual growth in June, up from the 21 percent observed in May. Industrial production related sectors led the Index for the fifth consecutive month while the Arts, Public sector, defence and community and Banking sectors exhibited annual declines. Germany remained the star performer, leading all countries up.
